Purchase Only One of Many Being Made From Country; U. S. Trade May Be Imperiled.

By HOLLAND.

A year ago one of the New York merchants who imports articles especially designed for the Christmas trade bought in other lands, principally Japan, Christmas goods of the value of \$6,000,000. This year he has bought and imported goods of like character of a value between \$7,000,000 and \$8,000,000. Every penny involved in this purchase went to Germany. Every one of the articles thus imported were of German make. They commanded our market because the price was lower than that demanded for similar articles

manufactured élsewhere. This is only one incident in our recently resumed German trade. Probably there are many others. In fact rumors of heavy perchases of German made commodties are in circulation. But th's incident is authentically reported because the importer who bought these goods himself admitted the purchase and the

Other Trade Threatened.

Some part of this \$1,000.000 or \$5,005.000, perhaps all of it, will be of service to Gormany in meeting reparation obligations. Remedy Possible.

It was said this morning by a man of great influence in New York, that his own investigations justified him in saying that if organized labor in three of the greater industries, namely: Building, coal mining and raliroad, would be willing to accept wages which would reflect changed conditions and reduced cost of living, then in 90 days much of the unemployment would end because these industries would be so gu'ckened by the new attitude of labor towards them that there would be employment for all, at least all who are competent for service in the raliroad, the coul and in the building industries.




