Europe Demands Passports From Germans, Yanks

Frenchmen, Englismen and Spaniards, Etc., Travel Freely-Action in Retaliation for U. S. \$10 Fee.

Paris, Oct. 7 .- Practically alone among travelers the American in Europe is still forced to cling to his passport, resulting in delays to busi-ness men as a result of which rival

almost as freely as before the war owing to friendly conventions be-twe n their respective governments. Italy within a month will have open borders.

Passport Obligatory.

Only the German and the American will then have to have passports and vises to travel in Europe. Not only is the passport obligatory to the Americans—because America makes it obligatory to the foreigner—but its costs him more in visas than frequently all his train and

boat fares cost him.

To restrain the immigrant flood the United States put its visa fee at the unheard of price of \$10 two years ago, charging Americans the same so as not to be open to a charge of discrimination.

The \$10 did not restrain the immigrants. They only had to borrow that much more or work a few weeks longer, or wait until Cousin Pietro r Brother Stanislasavitch in Amerca sent it to them.

Fee Remains. Then the United States limited the number of incoming immogrants. That proved efficacious. Hundreds of thousands would-be immigrants are now storming the United States

consular offices in Europe in vain.
But—overlooked in the rush, maybe—the \$10 fee remains. Not only
that, but the methods of consular officials, the reels and reels of red tape unwound in a bureau which never existed before the war, the re-taliatory methods adopted by other European nations are wearing the patience of American travelers in Europe to the proverbial thread.

A Frenchman can go from Paris to Constantinople for his railway fare and \$1.25 in visas. An English-man has to pay nearly \$2. An American in London bound for Constantinople finds he must secure no less than 11 visas costing \$110, or \$35 more than the fare on the train-de-luxe.


