Cudahy Wins Suit Against Water Board

The Metropolitan Utilities district has been reversed by the United States court of appeals, St. Paul, Minn., in an action brought by the 1120 City Nat. Bk. Bidg. Jackson 1426. Cudahy Packing company, to obtain the return of \$47,461.49, paid by the company under protest.
The Cudahy Packing company held a contract with the former Omaha Water company for water service at the rate of 41-2 cents per thousand gallons for 10 years, be-ginning June 1, 1904. The city acquired the water plant July 1, 1912, before the expiration of that contract, and the water board attempted to abrogate the contract by establishing a new rate of 8 cents per thousand gallons to the packers. The Cudahy company paid the new rate and then brought suit in federal court. The decision in the lower court here was in favor of the Metropolitan Utilities district, but the higher court held that the contract entered into by the old water company was valid for the 10-
