Nebraska Banks Get \$719,000 for Farmers' Relief

Forty-Six Country Banks Got Nearly Million Dollars Last Week From the War Finance Corporation.

Substantial relief, amounting to \$719,000, was brought to Nebraska banks and their borrowers through the war finance corporation last week. This amount was divided among 46 country banks and applied by them to the improvement of agri-cultural conditions. A total of \$2,-273,000 has been lent in Nebraska by the War Finance corporation.

In some counties small attention s being paid to the offer of long time, low interest agricultural loans. According to one explanation, this is in part due to the belief that the proposition is considered counter to all that is known of human nature and is too good to be true. The formation of county organizations of bankers is spreading information about the government loan system and it is expected to stimulate requests for money to aid farmers. Banks that have put through one loan are coming back for more. Five banks of Hamilton county have had loans of \$102,000 approved. Greeley county, whose 11 banks have loans of more than \$400,000 under nego-

tiation, some of them already made, still holds the record. F. W. Thomas, chairman of the Nebraska committee of the War Finance corporation, announces that in the last week applications amounting to \$1,580,000 from 93 banks were sent to Washington for approval and payment. Since the start loans recommended have amounted to \$5,313,000, distributed among 291 banks and loan companies. At the committee meeting Saturday and Sunday, 56 applications amounting to \$643,000 were approved and for-warded to Washington for final
