While the Lamson-Schmader bout is just one of a trio of 10-round affairs, this fistic clash bids fair to be the main event of the evening, not because it has been advertised as such, but because of the intensive rivalry which exists between Schmader and the Indian.

When the "Dutchman" and the Indian square off it will not be the first meeting between this pair of knuckle whirlers. No, since the principals in this bout have engaged blows on two previous occasions, the Indian emerging victorious in each. However, the last meeting ended when Andy fouled his opponent in the late rounds of a 10-stanza maul.

Schmader and Lamson have been training at their respective camps, and according to the press agents, are ready to hear the gong that will send them on their journey to a fat little purse. Both heavyweights were granted permission to remain at their camps until this morning.

The Louisville slugger's arm, which was broken last summer in a bout out in the state, has healed in dandy shape and is not expected to handicap its owner during tonight's go.

However, should Schmader plant one of his hard wallop on Lamson's head and arm, the chances of a quick ending look possible.

Lamson and his corps of trainers have been working out in Lincoln. The Indian is said to be in even better shape than he was when he battled Hughie Walker in Des Moines last winter. This announcement, no doubt, isn't received as good news in the Schmader camp.

With both Lamson and Schmader in good condition and each holding a grudge against the other, prospects for a slashing, battering, slam-bang affair in the old fight shed look mighty rosy.

In the semi-wind-up, "Kid" Schlaifer, recent conqueror of Gunner Joe Quinn, meets one Jimmy Nichol of Chicago in a 10-round affair, which should be an interesting mill while it lasts.
