Luehring's Loss Severe Blow to Nebraska Uni

Cornhuskers Rise to Athletic Fame Under Direction of Athletic Head—Minnesota Joyous.

The announcement that Fred Luehring, athletic director of the University of Nebraska, would resign his post to accept a similar position at Minnesota was not without its surprises.

The transfer of Luehring from Nebraska is a blow to the Cornhuskers. Under his direction the school rose to prominence and won the championship of its conference repeatedly.
