

Europe has found the means to buy and pay for wheat and corn greater in amount than was ever bought by Europe before. The gold that has come and is coming to the United States rapresents payments for food and cotton, Europe has been able to buy cotton in enormous amounts and pay for it. The German manufacturers of cotton cloths were shrewd when Great Britain seemed to be stupid, for Germany bought very heavily of American cotton when the market price for it was low, whereas the English manопопопопопопопо of American cotton when the market price for it was low, whereas the English manufacturers refrained. Germany has helped our export trade, as American agriculture on the whole has helped it to such an extent that it almost balances the falling off in our exports of manufactured stricks. For instance, Germany in 1921 took 1,275,000 bales of cotton, and that was nearly \$500,000 bales more than she took in the previous year. Wheras, on the other hand. Secretary Hoover's statistics show that Great Britain took 10,000 bales less than Germany did in 1921 and 700,000 bales less than Germany took in 1929.
