Omaha Bee Leased Wire. New York, Feb. 14,-Movement of prices for stocks and bonds was again uite surpassed in interest today by the action of foreign exchange and wheat. Such expectation as had been entertained last week that the rise in these two markets had run its course was promptly upset on today's resumption of business. Sterling exchange, which had fallen from \$4.38 3-4 to \$4.31 3-4 on the three last days of the past week, rose abruptly to \$4.36 1-2. Wheat for May delivery which sold at \$1.27 per bushel less than a week ago, and which closed at \$1.33 on Saturday, advanced in an extremely excited market at Chicago today to \$1.39 1-2. It is the highest price paid in the present crop except for two or three days in the early autumn; it compared with \$1.07 1-2 in January and \$1.03 1-4 in November. The character of the day's wheat market clearly indicated that the speculative grain trade had suddenly awakened to a realizing sense of its erroneous estimates of the past few months re-garding the world's balance of sup-ply and requirements.


