

Ma Greb Wins Light-Heavyweight Title by Victory Over Gene Tunney

Pittsburgh Boxer's Whirlwind Style of Attack on Champion Earns Him Judges' Decision

Omaha Bee Local Wire. Madison Square Garden, May 23.—Harry Greb, the flashy Pittsburgh scrapper, won the American light-heavyweight championship in Madison Square Garden today by defeating Gene Tunney, the pride of Greenwich Village, in 15 spirited although not very scientific rounds.

There never was a time during the bout that Greb ceased up on his whirlwind style of attack on the local boxer. Greb is surely a busy person and he seemed to be punching at Tunney than the latter had probably had to contend with before in his boxing career. There were moments during the bout that it appeared Greb was resorting to foul tactics, the crowd accusing him of holding and using his head continually in the clinches.

The fans booed and hooted the Pittsburgher for his foul work, but the referee never paid any attention to it. For the first five rounds Tunney enjoyed a slight edge, cutting Pittsburgher around with left and right shots to the body and at times appeared to be on his way to victory when he suffered a severe cut over the left eye during a scuffle in the sixth round.

The cut over his eye proved too much of a handicap, the steady stream of blood blinding him, and Greb taking advantage of the situation never failed to make the damaged optic his target. There was some who said it was a butt from the Pittsburgher that caused the cut, although the close work was satisfied that it was a hard right smash straight from the shoulder.

After the sixth round, Tunney fought gamely, but the handicap appeared too much for him and the Pittsburgher rallied and steadily piled up points to the end of the fight. That gained him the judges' decision.
