

Chang's Soldiers Mutiny, Support Gen. Wu Pei-Fu

Forces Along Chinese Eastern Railroad Revolt Against Manchurian Dictator in Favor of Enemy General.

Harbin, Manchuria, May 29.—(By A. P.)—The soldiers of Gen. Chang Tso-Lin along the Chinese Eastern railroad have mutinied and declared in favor of Gen. Wu Pei-Fu, who defeated Chang in the recent battles around Peking. Almost the entire railroad is in the hands of troops who have revolted against the Manchurian dictator and are supporting Gen. Wu, now in control of Chih-Li.

Severe Fighting.

London, May 29.—Severe fighting has been in progress on the Kiangsi front, according to Hongkong reports to The Times. Sun Yat Sen's main army is said to have captured Nei Ling Pass, which the Kiangsi troops had heavily fortified.

The right wing of the army has captured Sinfeng and is pursuing the enemy toward Nankangshien, while the left wing has defeated the enemy on the Hunan frontier and is marching toward Chungking.

Foreign Minister Resigns.

London, May 29.—A Reuters dispatch from Peking says that Dr. W. W. Yen, the foreign minister, resigned Saturday and left for Shanghai today. The dispatch adds that Dr. Yen apparently is making way for Dr. Wellington Koo, who arrived in Peking Sunday morning.

On Way to Lanchow.

Tientsin, May 29.—(By A. P.)—Gen. Wu Pei-Fu's army of Chihli soldiers have passed Tongshang on their way to Lanchow. Another division has been ordered to advance. Gen. Chang Tso-Lin, it has been definitely established, has recaptured Changli. Thirty thousand Chihli troops are moving overland toward Yungkingtu obviously for an out-flanking movement. Nine thousand Chihli soldiers have crossed the great wall, moving in the direction of Chinchow. Their leaders confidently expect a resumption of hostilities within three or four days.

George Roberts Gives \$10,000 to Willard Hall

George A. Roberts, grain broker, subscribed \$10,000, one-tenth of the total amount being raised to establish Willard hall, the proposed residence for employed women and girls, to be located at the former Brownell hall on South Tenth street.

Mr. Roberts has taken an active interest in the campaign. He is chairman of the large contributions committee. David Cole, treasurer of the Willard hall association, pledged \$5,500. Gould Dietz and Bishop Homer Stuntz each subscribed \$1,000. The campaign for \$100,000 was launched in the church Sunday.

"We haven't arrived at any totals yet," said Mr. Cole, "but every indication points toward success. We can't fail with this drive. The danger is too great."

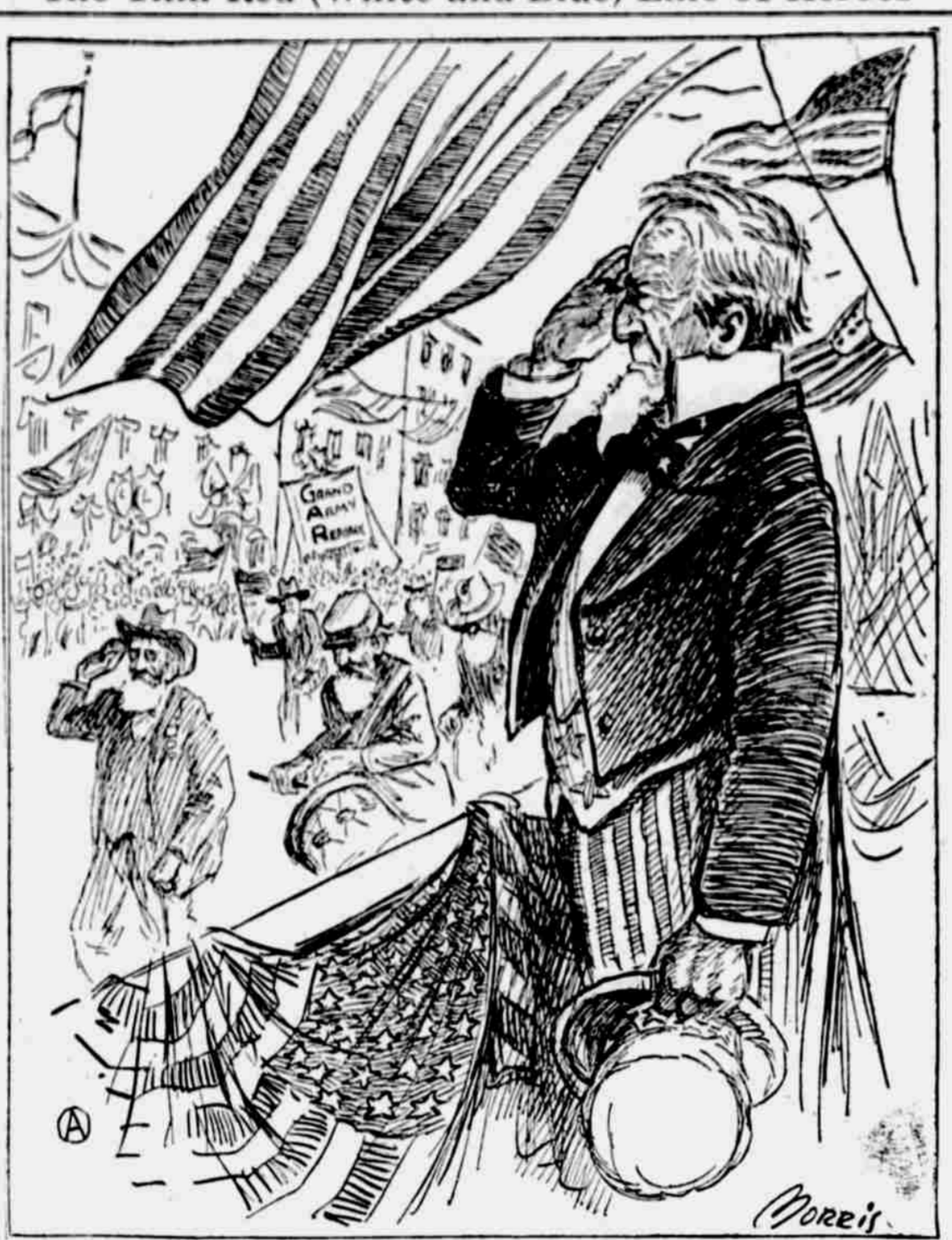

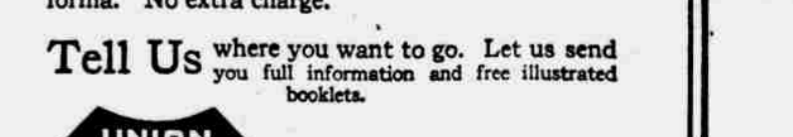
