Dr. Bessey to Speak at Colorado

At the dedication of the new science and administration building of Colorado College, February 22, Dr. Bessey will deliver an address on "The Possibilities of the Botanical Laboratory." Among other speakers who will give addresses at the dedication are: Chas. R. Van Hise, president of the University of Wisconsin, on "Colorado as a Field for Scientific Research," and Samuel Lawrence Bigelow, acting director of the laboratory of general physical chemistry in the University of Michigan, on "The Growth and Function of the Modern Laboratory."

The new structure, which is to be christened under the name of Palmer Hall, is a spacious building, and will make a good addition to the campus.

Law Athletics Organized.

The Board of Athletics in the law department has met and perfected an organization of athletics, having elected officers and framed regulations to be more fully discussed later. F. L. 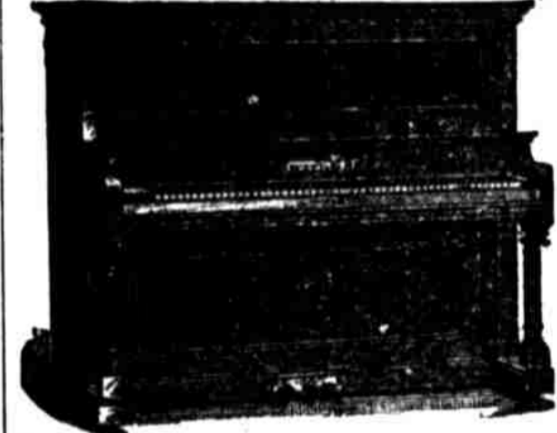
