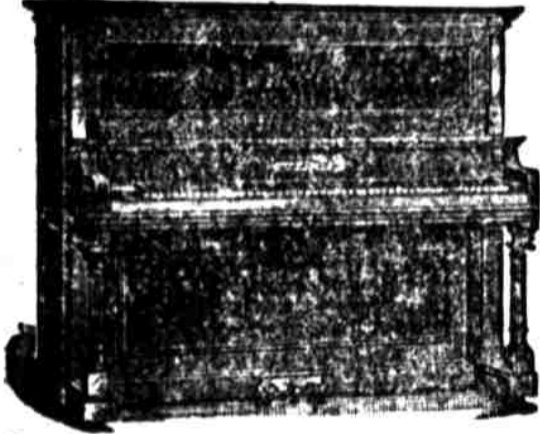

There will be two addresses, one by Mr. Fred Shepard, on "Washington, The Man," and another "Washington, the Citizen," by Prof. H. W. Caldwell, of the University. The admission is free, and all are cordially invited.

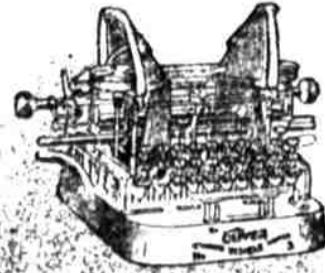
