

Meeting of Western College Presidents at Missouri.

"One of the most important educational conferences of late years will be held here April 26, when the presidents of all the state universities in the north half of the Mississippi valley will attend. It is proposed to make this an annual conference. No set program has been adopted, and the conference will last several days.
