College of Medicine Offers Courses in Summer School.

Dean H. B. Ward announces that in addition to the courses in physiology and zoology already offered by his department for the summer session, there will be a course in human anatomy.

The work will be under the direct supervision of the department of anatomy in the College of Medicine and will be given by a member of the departmental staff. The entire facilities of the department will be open to the class and the work will be given with the same thoroughness that characterizes the regular semestral courses in this subject. While it will regularly be open only to those having a certain minimum preparation, it may be possible to extend the opportunity further to such as have special reason for desiring to take the work.

The College of Medicine gave work in the summer session of last year, when Dr. H. H. Waite of the department of bacteriology offered a thorough course in laboratory bacteriology, open not only to students, but generally to practitioners and all persons interested who had had sufficient previous training to take up this line of work. It is hoped that the way may open for similar advantages year after year and that opportunity may be afforded each summer for such medical men as are interested to review some phase of medical work and to become acquainted with modern methods of study in this field. The time of year is one at which it is more than ordinarily possible to devote time to such study. The shortness of the summer term can be combined with intensive work with the result of covering thoroughly a limited field.

Further information regarding the matter may be had from the director of the summer school or the dean of the College of Medicine.

The formal announcement of the course is as follows:

Human Anatomy—Especially for the advantage of medical students. A practical course in human anatomy will be offered in the summer school open to all students who have had previously a course in human anatomy or osteology. The course will occupy the entire time of the student and will enable each person to complete the equivalent of one year's work in practical anatomy in the College of Medicine.

As it will be possible to register only a limited number of persons, those desiring to secure admission may engage definite parts and will receive a definite assignment upon payment to the University treasurer of ten dollars (\$10) to be credited on the fee. Laboratory fee for the course will be twenty-four dollars (\$24). Those who desire Medical College credit will be able to secure it through passing the regular examinations under the head of the department.

The work will consist of daily quiz, with laboratory work mornings and afternoons, daily. The course will be given by Dr. C. W. M. Poynter, quizmaster in anatomy in the medical faculty.

It is essential that all who intend to take the work should meet for the first class exercise at 8 a. m. in M. 301, Friday, June 10. Early registration will be of great advantage to the student.

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
