Photographic Exhibit in Art Hall Attracts Attention.

The fifteenth annual convention of the Nebraska Photographers' association opened its session yesterday in the Art hall. About 125 representative artists of the state are in attendance, and the work and materials of about sixty firms are on exhibition. These come from all over the country, the Aristo company, of Jamestown, N. Y., and the Eastman Kodak company, of Rochester, N. Y., occupying large and prominent places. The exhibit is proving quite an attraction to University students and the people of Lincoln, and a large crowd is expected to fill the hall this afternoon. No admission will be charged.
