The feed mill has been set up in the shops at the State Farm, and is now grinding feed for use there.

Professor Miller of the forestry department is now at the forest reserve near Halsey, Neb., where the forestry boys are at work.

The students in the study of woods are now at work learning the scientific names of the trees from which the principal kinds of woods are secured.

In the department of botany it has been necessary again to make a rearrangement of the books and specimens in order to get more room for laboratory material in the storeroom.

Professor Bessey was called to Iowa yesterday by the death of his sister, Mrs. Cyrus Smith, who has lived for many years in Iowa and Nebraska. During his absence Dr. Clements will look after his classes in botany.

Tomorrow morning at 7 o'clock the Glee club will leave for a three days' trip, appearing at Norfolk Friday night, and at Wisner Saturday night. Twenty men will be included in the trip.

A system of exhaust pipes has been installed in the forges at the State Farm shops, to take off the smoke. The forges have hand instead of force blasts, since the former are more generally in use among the farmers of the state. The new exhaust pipes measure from 8 to 42 inches in diameter.

Chancellor Andrews received a letter yesterday from the University of Wisconsin, announcing the election of Miss Elsie M. Blandin, Nebraska '02, as fellow in English Literature at that institution. Miss Blandin made an enviable record while a student at this University and her many friends here will be gratified to learn of her success at Wisconsin.
