**Pedagogical Club Meeting.**

After a brief social period Professor Luckey opened the meeting with a practical talk on the plans of the club. The club, which meets from month to month, is temporary or supplementary. There is also a permanent organization, which admits only graduates and that too graduate of special qualifications. It is hoped to have arrangements made by permanent clubs in different universities by which a member of the club will be received by any other club. Nebraska is taking the initiative in bringing about such arrangements.

Professor Luckey also touched upon the fact that a substantial number of the members of the club have already secured positions.

At the close of his preliminary remarks he introduced Superintendent Stephens of the city schools, who spoke on a superintendent's idea of interviews with teachers who are seeking positions, and his idea of recommendations, etc. He presented very clearly and pointedly some useful hints on these matters. His hints as to interviews may be summed up in these words: Be natural and frank, and be sure you really know what you are talking about.

Superintendent Stephens then proceeded to speak of some qualifications necessary for retaining a position, carriage, voice, quality of eye, earnestness.

The next topic was the means of judging a teacher.

1. Manner of conducting the work.
2. Results.

In connection with the latter he emphasized the kind of facts (type facts) which should be presented. Results should be those which typify things of real value. He also laid stress on the power to develop a genuine interest, and, coupled with this, thoroughness. As to the manner of managing a school he suggested personality, aptitude in presenting, magnetism and sympathy.

Superintendent Stephens' address was a forcible presentation of facts which must be of service to those who are about to enter the public schools as a teacher.

Professor Luckey next called upon Professor Jackson to make some remarks as to the permanent club. The plan is to hold a meeting some time during commencement week, probably on Alumni Day.

This meeting closed a successful series.
