Valuable Portrait Found.

At last, after many years of search, a portrait has come to light of Ne-koma, perhaps the most widely known and most talked of Indian woman among all the plains tribes. Ne-koma was an Iowa, and became the wife of John Gale, a surgeon of the Sixth regiment, United States infantry, by whom she had one daughter, who married Joseph La Flesch (Iron Eye), chief of the Omahas, and of this union came Bright Eyes, famous throughout this country and Europe as a lecturer on Indian Rights and who became the wife of T. H. Tibbles, editor of the Nebraska Independent. Ne-koma after her desertion by Dr. Gale, married Peter A. Sarpy, the noted Nebraska pioneer and fur trader. This interesting story, with accompanying portraits has been prepared for the Morton History of Nebraska.

Regarding The Exposition.

An interesting concession at the world's fair is "The Creation." A spectator is embarked on a boat and whisked through past centuries, going back through many scenes until he reaches the Garden of Eden. But he still goes back, through the spectacular phases of evolution. There is a paradisaical finale full of electricity and color.

"The Cliff Dwellers" furnishes many interesting sights. A representation of the most ancient of the famous cliff dwellings to be found in the Mancos and Cape Verde canyons in Arizona and New Mexico, is exhibited. There is a mammoth cliff over one hundred feet high, where are shown the rude habitations of the now extinct cliff dwellers. People can climb and pass through all parts.

"The Temple of Mirth" is well named. It will consist of about 75 to 100 French plate mirrors and a few distorting mirrors, set so as to give the most absurd grotesque reflections to the visitor, who is lost and trying to find his way out. These distorting mirrors will look like an ordinary mirror, but the effect will be funny, and will be seen throughout this labyrinth. Guides will be along to show the visitors the thousand of themselves in reality.

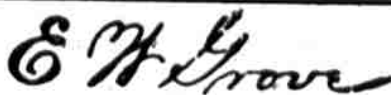
