BAND WILL ORGANIZE.

Officers May be Chosen at the Meeting This Evening.

A meeting of the Cadet Band will probably be held this evening for the purpose of effecting an organization. President L. J. Pepperberg says that prospects for a good band this year are excellent, as there will be over forty-five candidates to choose from at once. A number of last year's best musicians are not back this year, however, among the absentees being Mr. C. B. Cornell, chief musician last year, who is at present touring with a concert company; C. R. Benny, solo cornetist, who is studying dentistry in Kansas City, and Hellman, the snare drum man. For this reason it is desired to organize as soon as possible. We are requested to all attend to a by-law passed at the last meeting of the band, to the effect that any organization desiring the band's services must notify the business manager or the chief musician at least three days in advance. Lack of such a rule as this caused much confusion last year.

WILL GO TO ST. LOUIS.

Nebraska Athletes Will Enter the Olympian Games.

It is probable that Nebraska will be represented in the races of the olympian games at St. Louis this fall. Dr. Clapp has decided to organize a team for this purpose, if possible, and work may begin next week. It is the intention of Dr. Clapp to enter the team for the 3-mile cross-country run. The first mile of this race is to be run on the stadium track, the next six miles cross country, and the final mile on the stadium track again. Five men will compose the team—perhaps the following: States, Havens, Smith, Heath and Winchester.

The team may also be sent to Chicago to compete in the western intercollegiate cross-country championship meet during November, in which all the prominent western teams will be represented.

The Y. M. C. A. has opened up this year in full force and is preparing to do a big year's work. Good work has already been done in securing positions for students, jobs amounting to \$4,943.60 having been given out up to September 27. The membership of 285 last year has had 40 new members added to it so far this year. Five hundred student hand books have been distributed among faculty and students.

Eight Bible classes are starting up and much good is expected to be done in this work.

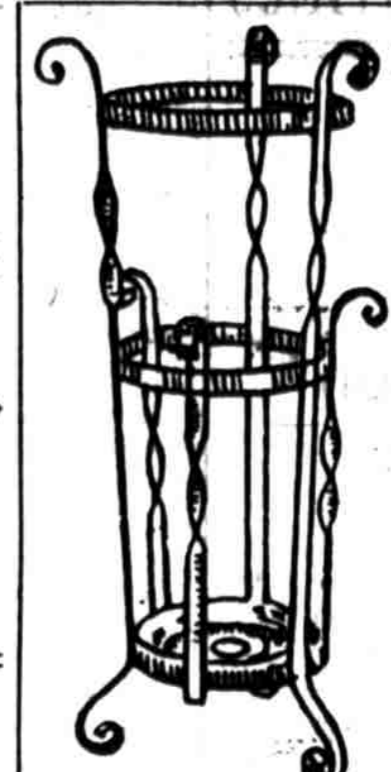
