J. B. Davidson, '04, has returned from Moline, Ill., and will take charge of the forge shop at the state farm, the first of next week.

Professor Richards of the electrical engineering department is busy as consulting engineer for the city in the purchase of an electric light plant.

The management of the engineers' annual report work already begun on that book. H. B. Warren is editor-in-chief and R. B. White business manager.

J. C. Holmes, who has been surveying for the Burlington during the summer, returned to school Thursday, to take up work in the civil engineering department.

Prof. F. A. Sheldon of the State Historical society, will leave for St. Louis today, where he will take part in preparing for the Nebraska Day exercises at the exposition.

Dr. C. H. Gordon, who formerly had charge of advanced classes in mineralogy and petrography in the university, is now professor of geology in the state school of mines, at Secora, N. M.

Oklahoma University has recently completed a fine stone building, provided with modern improvements of every sort, for the department of geology. The department is in charge of Moses, Gould and Woodruff, both of whom were former assistants in the Nebraska geological department.

Ernest Mann, formerly of Otoe county, but now of Lincoln, has just presented to the state museum a fine head of the fossil, or primitive muskox, with horns and other parts complete. This was found in a well, about two feet below the surface, and is the only good specimen of its kind ever found in the state.

Professor Morse of the electrical engineering department did not meet his classes Wednesday and Thursday. His time is taken up tabulating bids for an electric light plant to be put in by the city.
