**In Other Colleges**

Last year endowments to Columbia college amounted to \$1,783,138. This averages \$375 for each student.

All students who took part in the Spanish-American war have been granted free tuition at the university of Iowa.

Great interest is taken in the approaching Yale-Princeton debate. Last year both Yale and Harvard defeated Princeton in debate, and this year efforts will be made to turn the tables.

The anti-fraternity law has recently been suspended at the Ames university. Many of the locals are now petitioning for chapters from the national fraternities.

Water sports are gaining prominence at the University of Pennsylvania by the acquisition of a large tank in the gymnasium. A swimming crew has recently been organized.

At the university of Minnesota, Tuesday, Nov. 8, was granted as a holiday and as a result there was a general exodus of students to their homes for the purpose of voting.

A woman's track meet will be held at Minnesota some time in the spring. It is planned to have the meeting conducted on the same lines as those of the men's.

The National convention of the Alpha Phi's has just been held at Syracuse, N. Y. The exercises closed with a grand banquet, when covers were laid for 200 women.

Before the big football game at Northwestern, the Athletic department bought 5,000 \$1 pennants and sold them at 50c apiece. As a result the bleachers were a "sea of waving color."

In the state of Michigan one out of every 129 persons is pursuing a collegiate education, either in Michigan university or in outside colleges and universities.

It has been recently announced that Harvard university and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology will be united. Each will continue with its separate faculty and administration, the difference being that all sciences will be taught at the Institute of Technology and liberal arts will fall to Harvard.

Trouble arises in one of the great educational universities of the Pacific coast. Bitter complaint is heard there from the men, who forced in the back row, are unable to see or hear the lecture through the forest of intervening picture hats. The university daily paper discussed the difficulty as a "serious" one, but suggested no remedy—Yale Alumni Weekly.

In response to petitions by several of the political clubs at Cornell, asking that election day be made a holiday, the faculty adopted the following resolution: "Resolved, that while it is the established policy of the university to grant freely leaves of absence to all students desiring to leave town to vote it is not considered expedient to suspend exercises on election day, November 8."
