AN UNDESIRABLE GAME.

Now that sufficient time has elapsed for the disappointment of defeat at the hands of the Haskell Indians to have passed, the view that seems prevalent among the students ought to be given some consideration. This view is that we should not schedule another game with the Indians. In defeating them no honor is gained, and in being defeated much is lost. The Haskell team knows no time limit rule applicable to their players. One man on their team has played football for twelve years in college elevens, and most of the others are beyond the usual four year limit.
