**What Has Been Done During the Past Six Weeks.**

The following is a list of the work done by the Y. W. C. A. during the first six weeks of the school year.

- 1,500 handbooks published jointly, with Y. M. C. A.
- 55 letters of welcome written, during vacation to prospective new students.
- All trains met four days during registration week.
- Card catalog of rooms and boarding places in Lincoln.
- Noon lunch served registration week in association room.
- 200 hundred students helped to find room and boarding places.
- 35 young women assisted in securing room-mates.
- 21 young women assisted in securing employment.
- Opening reception for all university women at Gov. J. H. Mickey's.
- 16 new members secured.
- Total membership 119. One year ago 148.
- 200 calls made first six months on Freshman girls.
- Flowers sent to sick girls.
- Regular weekly gospel meetings with an average attendance of 70.
- Song service in association room each day 12:20 to 12:30. Attendance 40.
- Systematic daily Bible study; present enrollment 115.
- Mission study; 9 classes; present enrollment 45. Class joined with Y. M. C. A.
- An association room with a welcome for every university girl open till 10 p. m. each day and offering every convenience from a cup of hot cocoa at the

noon hour to a postage stamp and needle and thread.

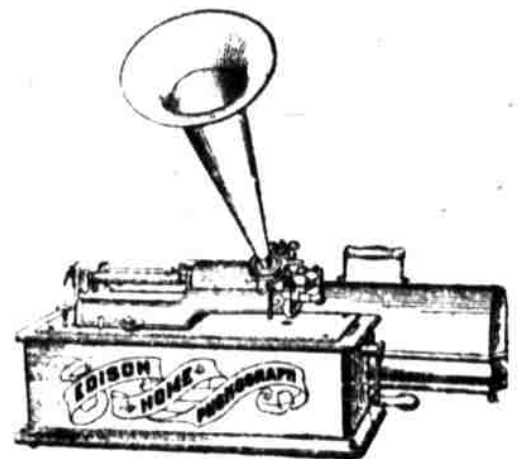
