Judge Webb Tomorrow.

At the Men's meeting at the Oliver Sunday afternoon, Judge W. D. Webb of Atchison, Kan., will deliver an address entitled "The Trial of Jesus Christ from a Lawyer's Standpoint." Judge Webb is a jurist of fine reputation and one of the ablest legal lights of the central west. He has given lectures throughout the country to immense audiences. The press all over the country has been enthusiastic in its praise for Judge Webb. The esteem with which he is held among eminent jurists is seen from the recommendation of David J. Brewster, associate justice supreme court of the United States. "He argued many cases before me," said the justice, "while I was on the supreme bench of Kansas, and later on the circuit bench of the United States. I always found him an accurate and painstaking lawyer, one who presented his case clearly and fully and in whose statements the court implicitly relied."

A large crowd will undoubtedly be present. The doors will open promptly at 3:30 and every man who desires a good seat should be on hand early.

The musical attraction will be of unusual merit. Prof. Clemens Movius, the late director of the Nebraska Conservatory of Music will render some select solos. Prof. Movius has been prominent in musical circles in Lincoln for many years.
