Campus Gleanings

During the vacation Dr. Bessey went east as far as Oberlin, Ohio, returning in time to read his paper on "The Grade-Hour System" before the State Teachers' Association in Omaha.

Basket-ball is now in full swing at the school of Agriculture. In spite of the inadequate room the armory is the scene of daily contests between selected teams from the different classes.

While Professor Smith was at the International Live Stock Exposition, about two weeks ago, he purchased a fine Aberdeen-Angus steer, which is now a member of the bovine family at the State Farm. It is the intention to fit him for next year's show and if he fulfills his promises, will no doubt maintain the university's reputation as a producer of fine stock.

A paper is being circulated among faculty and students at the school of agriculture for the purpose of getting subscriptions to a fund to be used for improving the athletic field. This is a deserving cause and is receiving liberal encouragement from all concerned. With proper improvement the athletic field at the farm is destined to become the pride of the school and the university. It is located on a level plot just north of the experiment station buildings and is almost entirely surrounded by trees.

The parlors at the College Settlement house, Twentieth and M streets were nicely filled Tuesday evening, December 20th, with friends and parents to witness the Christmas program given by the Girls' club. The first number was a "Welcome Song" by twenty-five girls from seven to fourteen years of age. The remainder of the hour was taken up with recitations and music. Since early November the weekly meetings under the direction of the College Settlement committee of the Y. W. C. A. have been taken up in practicing for this entertainment. After the program Santa Claus appeared with a bag of candy and nuts for each of the girls.

Ex-State Superintendent Fowler has asked the leading educational institutions of the state to give an opinion of the effects of football and college athletics on the educational system of Nebraska.

With few exceptions, it was declared that football and all the other forms of athletics had acted as a stimulant to scholarship, institutional pride and local enthusiasm. Many educators said that the sport had been distinctly helpful.

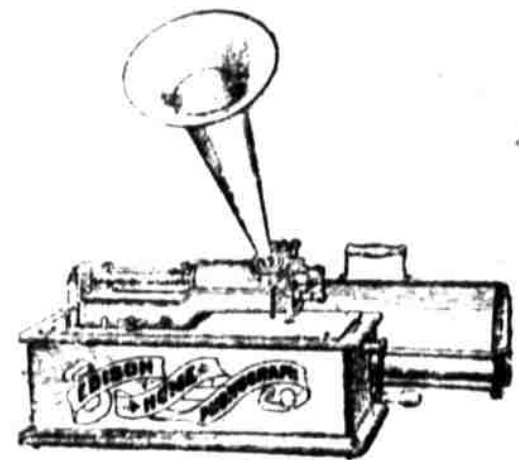
