In Other Colleges

President Bell, of Drake University, has taken a decided stand against student gambling on any athletic contests.

Because of the increased expenses of maintenance at Harvard the proposition of raising the tuition fee to \$200 is being considered. This would be an increase of \$50.

The report of the athletic treasurer of Harvard shows receipts from the various branches of athletics for the past season to be \$112,262.39 as against \$79,204.88 expenditures.

The University of Illinois is much stirred up at the action of their football men in circulating a petition among the students asking them to vote for a certain man for football manager.

For his consistent work through seven years on the second team at California the authorities of that university have awarded Larry O'Toole a football "C." This is the first time a California man not on the varsity has been awarded the varsity "C."

The freshmen at the University of Minnesota have riveted an iron plate with their class numerals there on to one of the lofty smoke stacks on the campus. The upper classmen are considering the advisability of ordering the freshmen to tear this piece of iron down.

Ralph C. Roberts, captain of the University of Illinois baseball team, was killed in a wreck on the Big Four when returning to school from his holiday vacation. Mr. Roberts was standing on the platform of the diner when the car left the track and was thrown under the wheels. A number of other students were more or less injured. Mr. Roberts was very popular in Illini circles and a prominent athlete. He was a member of Kappa Sigma.
