Prof. Chatburn has been requested to give a talk before the members of the Farmers' Institute at Tecumseh, Nebraska. His subject is to be, "Handling Dirt Roads."

Professor H. R. Smith returned yesterday from Topeka, Kan., where he took part in the deliberations of the Kansas State Live Stock association. On Tuesday he delivered an address before that organization on "The Feeding of the Breeding Herd."

A letter has been received from W. H. Blanchard who is on a locating survey party for the B. & M. at Lovell, Wyoming. Among the University men who are on the same party he mentions Glenn Mason, Roy Batten, B. E. Debler, F. P. Shumway, Ed. Hubbard and V. C. Wilburn. All except these last two men were in school the first of the semester and left during the Xmas holidays.

Professor Goss, dean of the engineering college of Purdue University, will give an address before the engineering society during the latter part of February. Prof. Goss designed and erected the first experimental locomotive testing plant, of which the testing plant exhibited by the Pennsylvania railroad at the St. Louis exposition was a copy. He is a recognized authority on locomotive work, and all students having friends among railroad men would do well to notify them of this address and extend an invitation to them to be present.

After 12 o'clock next Monday all of the classes at the school of agriculture will be dismissed for the week. This will permit both students and faculty to attend the meetings of the various state agricultural organizations and listen to the lectures that will be delivered by eminent men before those bodies. Among the prominent speakers who will be here are Geo. M. Rome, chief of the bureau of animal industry, Washington, D. C., Rred W. Rankin, Chicago, Ill., Joseph E. Wing, Breeders' Gazette Staff, Mechanicsburg, O., and several others of equal note.
