Yale will play thirty-nine inter-collegiate games of basketball this year.  
Tuesday Oberlin college lost a \$40,000 building by fire. The loss was only partially covered by insurance.  
When weather conditions permit California coeds will not wear headgear on the University campus.  
Thos. L. Shevlin, '06, has been unanimously elected captain of Yale's football team for the season of 1906.  
The University of Iowa has granted free tuition to all students who took part in the Spanish-American war.  
Hernstein, the man who coached the Haskell Indians last year, has applied for the position of football coach at Purdue.  
Illinois and Michigan have signed a contract for two games of football. One this year on Illinois field and one next year at Ann Arbor.  
Considerable comment has been caused at Michigan by the Salvation Army singing one of the college songs, the "Yellow and Blue."  
The lands belonging to the University of Texas comprise something over two million acres, scattered in twenty-five counties of the state.  
Oberlin students who lost their money in the failure of the Citizens' National bank through the operations of Mrs. Cassie Chadwick, have been reimbursed by Andrew Carnegie.  
On its eastern trip the Wisconsin basketball team played ten games, winning only two, those against Rochester University and Buell Athletic Club of Sharon, Pa.

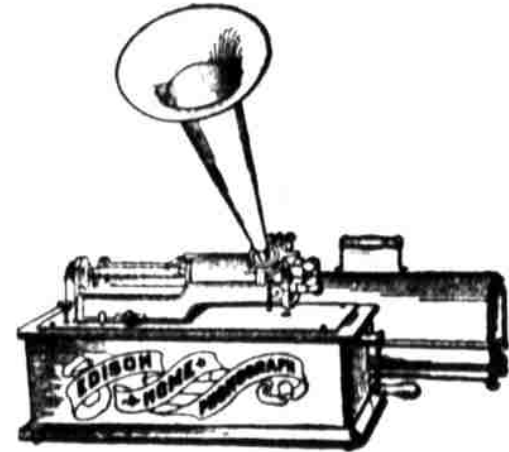
