In order that the members of the Senior class may recognize one of their number at sight the class of '05 at Harvard has adopted the scheme of wearing a small lapel button of the class colors.

The University of California library has recently received the smallest dictionary in the world. It is only one and one-eighth by three-fourths inches in dimensions. It contains 5,000 words besides about 1,500 idioms and phrases.

Arthur F. Duffey, the American runner, Saturday scored his first victory in Australia, capturing the hundred yards invitation handicap from scratch Time, 0:10 1-5. In the hundred yards open handicap Duffey lost the preliminary heat.

If the University of Pennsylvania Christian Settlement can raise \$7,500, Andrew Carnegie has promised to donate an equal amount towards the erection of a new building on the property now owned by the Christian association.

Minnesota will not have a baseball team this spring. For a time lack of financial support compelled the athletic board of control at that University to decide against a team, but with the election of a new board it was decided to put a team in the field. Owing to the lateness of starting, however, the gopher management was unable to make a suitable schedule of dates, and the idea of being represented on the diamond this spring has been given up.
