

The Forestry boys went to the Farm on Saturday in order to study the conditions in the government plantation at the southeast corner of the Farm.

Dr. W. D. Bridges will address the meeting of the Medical Society of the University to be held March 10th in M 301. The subject of his address will be the 'Clinical Advantages of Omaha.'

Professor Heald, of the Department of Botany, was called to Iowa Saturday night by the sudden death of Mrs. Heald's mother. During his absence his classes will be looked after by Professor Bessey and Dr. Clements.

The Department of Botany has received two packets of seeds of the Teosinte plant, from Mexico. This plant looks so much like field corn that many botanists think that it must be the original wild form from which corn has been developed.

In the last number of the Twentieth Century Farmer Professor Bessey describes the Seaside Laboratory on Vancouver Island at which he studied last summer. The article is illustrated by three photographs which give the reader some idea of the great size of the trees in the forests of the island.

**In Other Colleges**

The sororites of the University of Wisconsin have organized a bowling league.

These show that in the last four years the percentage of women students has increased from 46.1 to 56.6.
