Professor Bruner, of the Department of Entomology, is traveling with the Union Pacific corn special that is making a tour of the state this week.

Dr. Clements received a large box of botanical specimens Tuesday from Professor Paoletti, of Italy. The collection numbers seven or eight hundred specimens, very near all of which are of the Italian species. They will be mounted and added to the University Herbarium as soon as possible.

The botanical professors passed yesterday upon the thesis written by L. L. Harter and submitted to Professor Bessey a short time ago for the degree of Master of Arts. The work was accepted and Mr. Harter will take his examination about the first of May in order to receive his degree at the June commencement.

Academy Notes.

The girls basketball team of the Academy will play the city Y. W. C. A. five in the Y. W. C. A. gymnasium, corner of 12th and M streets, Thursday evening. Miss Mitchell has not decided definitely yet just who will represent the Academy in this game. The team will probably be picked from the following six girls who have been doing the most consistent work in practice: Misses Cameron, Cox, Wawvalter, Lute, Lyman and Barbour. The Academy team was able to defeat the Y. W. C. A. by a large score last year and it is expected that they will repeat the trick this year.

The girls will play a game with Wahoo High School the first week in April. A match has also been scheduled with Wesleyan University to be played some time this month. Another game may possibly be arranged with Bellevue towards the close of the season.

The baseball men of the Academy have been stirring up enthusiasm among the men this week in order to get out a good delegation at the first practice to be held Friday. The boys will meet for the first practice on the vacant lot south of the Academy building that was used for the football team to practice on last fall. A baseball committee consisting of Messrs. Russel, Webster, Smith and Morgan was appointed at the meeting of the men held Wednesday in Academy hall. The committee will have general supervision of the work and will circulate a subscription paper to raise money enough to purchase the necessary equipment to begin practice. Mr. C. A. Perry has been elected temporary manager of the team and should the committee be successful in securing the necessary finances to make the team a success a captain and manager will be elected at the meeting to be held Friday.

Professor Hodgman promises an innovation in the program of the debating club of the Academy Saturday evening. After the regular program, which will consist of parliamentary law practice, the critic's report and a debate on the question of the disfranchisement of the negro in the south, the principal will serve ice cream and cake.
