Two packages of specimens of grasses were received by the Department of Botany Thursday for the University Heibarium. They were sent by the Division of Agrostology in Washington. The packages contained one hundred and twenty-five specimens.

It is iljustrated by thirty-two plates, including nearly one thousand figures, many ot which are colored. When completed this will be the most important and useful book on these beautiful microscopic plants that has ever appeared.
