Campus Gleanings

Alpha Theta Chi gave a smoker last night at the Chapter House.

Twelve students from the class in experimental psychology attended the State Insane Asylum yesterday afternoon.

The psychological laboratory will soon have an additional spectroscope made by the Bausch and Lomb company in Germany.

Professor Webster of the University of Illinois called on his friends in the department of Botany and Entomology yesterday.

Two packages of specimens of grasses were received by the Department of Botany Thursday for the University Herbarium. They were sent by the Division of Agrostology in Washington. The packages contained one hundred and twenty-five specimens.

The first volume of a new Manual of the Desmids has just been received by the Department of Botany. It is illustrated by thirty-two plates, including nearly one thousand figures, many of which are colored. When completed this will be the most important and useful book on these beautiful microscopic plants that has ever appeared.

A large delegation of high school students from Wahoo, Neb., headed by Supt. Searson of the Wahoo city schools, visited the University yesterday. The students were taken through the various departments of the University and were given an idea of the size and of the management of the institution. Most high school students have but a very vague idea of what the University is and the visit, though short, was an interesting and profitable one for them.

M. J. A. Barrett, curator and librarian of the Nebraska State Historical Society, has recently compiled a list of the members of the Alumni Association of the University of Nebraska. According to the constitution of that organization, only graduates of the College of Literature, Science and Arts and the Industrial College, and all persons taking M. A. or Ph. D. are entitled to membership and of these there are to date one thousand five hundred and thirty.

The first dance given in disregard of the edict of the Women's Pan-Hellenic League was the Viking Informal at Walsh Hall Thursday night. Despite the absence of the active 'sorores' about twenty-five couples spent a most enjoyable evening. A majority of the girls were alumni of the various sororities while there was also present a number of non-sorority girls.
