A New History.

Professor Caldwell, Adjunct Professor Persinger and Mr. Alysorth, of the Department of American History are completing a source book on Nebraska territorial history. The work is a twenty-eight page pamphlet and will be entitled "Nebraska Territorial History told by its Makers." The book contains a brief typical and attractive summing up of Nebraska's early history from the records of the pioneers.

A special endeavor has been made to show the relation of Nebraska to the national struggles of the period from the Kansas-Nebraska bill to the close of the Civil war. It is illustrated with three maps showing Nebraska in different stages of its evolution.

The book will be ready in about a week. Sample copies will be sent to teachers of American History known by the Department, and to others on application, with the hope of introducing the pamphlet as a part of the work in American History in Nebraska schools next fall.
