The University of Indiana has been granted \$100,000 by the State legislature for the erection of a new library.

Andrew Carnegie has offered to Radcliffe College the sum of \$75,000 for a library building on condition that an equal sum shall be raised among the alumnae and friends of the college for endowment of the library.
