School of Superintendence.

The manager of the summer session sent out circular letters yesterday ad vertising the School of Superintend ence, which is to be held in connection with the summer school. The summer session will begin on June 16 this year. The School of Superintendence Assistant Manager - - Fred Naughton is rather an innovation in western summer schools. The first one ever offered by this University was held in - - R. A. Van Orsdel connection with summer school last year and proved very successful. An excellent corps of instructors has been secured for this year and it promises to be one of the best in the West.

A well-balanced course in lectures, library reading, and round table conferences under able superintendents has been planned.

Dean Roscoe Pound will lecture on Nebraska school laws, dealing especially with those phases of the subject that concern the problems to be met and solved daily by the busy principal and superintendent. The status of corporal punishment, the authority of teacher over pupils on their way to and from school, the power of boards of education in prescribing rules and courses of study, the decisions of the State department of Superintendence, and many other questions of absorbing interest will be discussed by Dean Pound.
