

NEBRASKA HONORED.

Represented on Toast List at Dinner of Class of '80 at Harvard.

Professor Taylor, of the department of Political Economy, was the recipient of a great honor this summer, which reflects credit upon Nebraska. While in the East upon his vacation he attended the dinner given by the class of '80 of Harvard upon its 25th anniversary, and was one of the six speakers upon that occasion. This class numbers among its members a great many famous Americans, chief of whom is President Roosevelt, and of these a large number attended the class dinner.

The Law School.

The situation in the law school, which was considerably muddled last June when school closed, has cleared completely during the summer. Dean Pound, who resigned early in the year, the resignation to take effect the end of the school year, was persuaded to reconsider and assume the duties of the position for another year. This will be a source of great satisfaction to the entire University, and especially to the students of the Law School, who held a number of mass meetings last year and devised means of retaining the dean.

Many changes have occurred, however. Professor Robbins, who has been an instructor since the very formation of the college, has resigned. His absence will be very much felt by the students, who have always made a favorite of Mr. Robbins, and have enjoyed the continuous run of satire and wit. In his place the regents have obtained two professors who will both devote full time to the work of the college. One of these is Professor Ayers, a graduate of Harvard in both Academic and Law. For several years he has been in active practice in Boston, but has been closely connected with Harvard Law School through the moot or "club" courts, as they are called. He was especially recommended to Dean Pound by the dean of Harvard Law School, and will be very valuable to the college.

The other man is Professor Costigan, who has received his master's degree from Harvard and is a graduate of the same law school. For several years he has been practicing in Denver and has been a professor in the Denver University Law School, where he was esteemed very highly.

Prof. W. G. Hastings has returned and will devote his entire time to the work, as formerly.

This will make four men giving their whole attention to the law work, and

with Mr. Wilson, who will teach in the morning, and Mr. Ledwith, who will assist Dean Pound, the Law School is assured of as good a force of instructors as any school in the West.

The law library has undergone quite a change for the better also. Duplicate sets of the more used reports and a number of reports lacking before have been purchased so that the present library is quite complete.

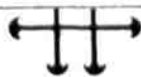
