Fraternity Colors.

A startling assortment of bright ribbons has appeared on the campus in the last couple of days, and new students whose verdancy is only too apparent are proudly displaying colors fastened in the lapels of their coats, reminding one for all the world of blue ribbon calves at a county fair. All this merely means that it is rushing season and that the fraternities are rapidly getting new pledges.
