HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETES OPEN CONTEST TODAY

TWENTY-FIVE TEAMS ENTERED
IN TOURNAMENT.

FRATS ARE TO ENTERTAIN SOME

But Whole Squads Will Be Taken by
Only Three Fraternities, Owing
to Disagreement.

The second annual high school basketball tournament commences at two o'clock this afternoon with twenty-five teams entered. The squads began to arrive early last evening and will not all get here until 11:00 o'clock this morning. Arrangements have been made for several teams to be entertained at different fraternity houses, but the remainder must put

up at some hotel at their own expense, although their railroad fare is paid to and from the tournament.

At a meeting of representatives of the fraternities Tuesday the decision was reached that as a body they would not entertain these visiting teams, although the individual fraternities could do as they wished about the matter. Several wanted to invite individuals from different teams, while a number thought that the squads should be kept together. This led to a discussion with the result that only three teams will be entertained, the Auburn squad by Delta Chi, Nebraska City by Sigma Nu, and Beatrice by Sigma Phi Epsilon. Individual men with whom they are acquainted will be kept by the other fraternities.

Order of Games.

Seven fast games are scheduled for this afternoon with twelve of the best known teams of the state playing. The order of the games this afternoon is as follows: Tecumseh-Ord, South Omaha-Trenton, Central City-Nebras-

ka City, Wahoo-Blair, Sidney-Elgin, Beatrice-Norfolk, Geneva-Auburn.

The remaining five games of the first series will be played this evening, beginning at 7:30, in the following order: Omaha-State Farm, Aurora-Gothenburg, York-Humboldt, Schuyler-Stromsburg, University Place-Stanton.

The championship series will continue Friday and will be finally decided by three games to be played Saturday evening at the Armory. If the first tournament can be taken as an indication, these games will be worth seeing and will bring out a lot of future University athletic material.

ment that extreme care has always been taken by all who work in the building and that he is satisfied that the defective wiring was the cause of the fire. The charred woodwork shows almost conclusively the course of the fire from its starting point and indicates that the source was in the wiring and subsequent melting of the gas meter. A witness, on the scene shortly after the fire caught, states that the gas issuing from the broken pipe was so ignited as to show that the cause lay near the meter. The material damage to the building will probably be entirely repaired within a short time.
