"That all signed statements, excepting those already acted upon by student committees shall be submitted to the conference eligibility committee through each faculty committee. The conference eligibility committee to pass upon each individual case according to its own merits.

"That the conference eligibility committee shall present its finding to each institution. An acceptance of this report shall be considered as the final act of reinstatement.

"That if it is found at any time that a student has misrepresented his signed statement or has subsequently been found guilty of participating in athletic contests contrary to the spirit of the amateur rule as interpreted by the Missouri Valley conference, he shall thereby become ineligible and subject to the discipline committee of his institution."
