NEBRASKA'S CHANCES GOOD

SPORTING WRITER PICKS CORNHUSKERS TO BEAT IOWA IN WRESTLING MEET.

Stewart Dobbs, sporting editor of the Lincoln Star, has the following to say in regard to Nebraska's chances in the wrestling meet with Iowa Saturday night:

"Nebraska's wrestling team will enter its dual meet with Iowa Saturday night as the picked winners. The Cornhuskers won last year, two of them veterans will probably go to the mat on this occasion, while the third bout should be close.

"Iowa brings one veteran, he being entered in an event where Nebraska has a new man, O'Connor, the Hawk-eye heavyweight, did not last very long before "Jelly" Elliott last year. The Iowa reports are that he was outweighed twenty pounds, but as he pleads guilty to 175 and Elliott weighed only 185 in wrestling trim, the handicap was not so great as the Iowa supporters would believe. Nebraska presents McCormick, who will weigh in at about the same mark as O'Connor.

"That Miller will have little trouble disposing of Gilliland of Iowa is the prediction of both factions. Miller is

a former Iowan and his reputation as one of the best college middleweights was earned while studying in that state. He is fast, nearly up to the limit in weight for his class, and knows every angle of the game.

"The lightweight match may be expected to decide the honors of the meet, although it is by no means certain that McCormick will fall before O'Connor. Should this class, however, turn out to be the deciding factor, much interest will be felt in the bout. Nebraska is in a quandry. Glen Ruby of last year's team is a crack, little below Miller in ability, but just now he is slightly overweight. He must train down before Friday or Guenther will take his place. Ruby is the best man in western colleges at his weight and will have considerable poundage on Gran. Guenther is a good man, but not the equal of Ruby, and his chances would be far from being as bright as those of the veteran."
