Number of Nebraska Students to Attend Other Schools.

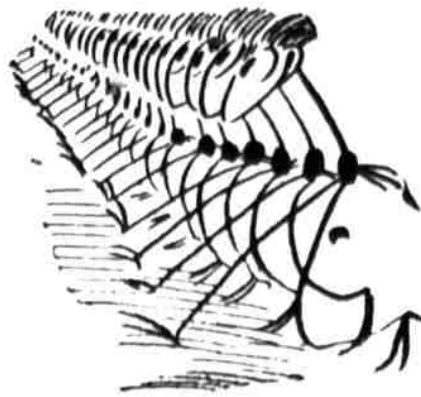
Nebraska University will furnish a number of students to eastern schools and colleges next year.
