## REPLIES TO ATTACK ON PENITENTIARY CONDITIONS

DR. M. A. BULLOCK SAYS PRISON IS NO PLACE FOR EMOTIONAL SYMPATHIES.

Speaking in defense of the National Prison association, of which he is the superintendent in Nebraska, Rev. M. A. Bullock said at convocation yesterday: "The state penitentiary was designed primarily for the protection of society and not for the reform of criminals. It is no place for emotional sympathies; the prisoners themselves secretly despise those who display such sentiments toward them; they want to be talked to like men."

Speaking of the alleged harsh treatment to prisoners, he said he had talked to hundreds of released convicts and that not one in fifty complained of this. He said that Sullivan himself, the convict whose testimony has been so often repeated, told him that no man who obeyed the prison rules need have any fear of cruel treatment.

As for the food served to the men, he said that Dr. Graham Taylor, just before leaving Lincoln, made the statement in the governor's office that the fare at the Nebraska penitentiary was better than in any other prison he had ever visited.

He admitted that much was yet to be accomplished in the way of improvement, and he said that the governor and the reform association have been collecting data and making plans since early last summer, but that they cannot do anything without money. The governor, he said, had planned some time ago to build a new sanitary kitchen raised above the ground if the legislature would vote the funds for it. The association also recommended that enough new cells be installed that each man might have a cell to himself or an enlargement of the cells so that more than two men could be kept in each cell. In addition he thought that the old and hardened criminals should be separated from the younger men and those who might be reformed.
