

CORNHUSKER TRACK MEN MEET KANSAS TOMORROW

FIFTEEN ATHLETES LEAVE, ACCOMPANIED BY COACHES STIEHM AND REED.

Tomorrow afternoon at 2:30 o'clock the Cornhusker track team meets its old enemy Kansas on the Jayhawkers' field. A strong aggregation of fifteen picked men left yesterday afternoon, accompanied by Coaches Stiehm and Reed and today is being spent in a short workout this morning and a rest this afternoon for the fray tomorrow.

Kansas' chance of points in the runs and relays is small, but she is considered dangerous in the hurdles and weights, the Woodbury boys being noted for their fast hurdling. Nebraska has representing her two fast men in this event, Barney and Russel, so fears of defeat are not so strong in this regard as in the discus and shot-put which were both lost to Ames in the meet last Saturday.

In the sprints, Racely, who was high man in the Ames meet, Christmas, who has shown up well in the early sea-

son workouts, and Beaver, who won first in the 110 yard dash from Ames, are entered for Nebraska. Cromwell, winner of the broad jump, and Hastings, the high jumper, are expected to put up a hard fight in these two divisions of the meet.

"Beany" McGowan, who caused much disappointment by failing to place with Ames, has recovered to a great extent and with Becker, who is also very fast, will take care of the half mile. Brannon and Anderson, it is anticipated, are due to give the Kansans some anxious moments on the longer runs.

Regular practice on the field will continue for those not taken to Kansas as the Minnesota meet comes off April 11, and a much larger number of men will be used. The size of the team taken to meet the Jayhawkers was necessarily limited by the expense of the trip.
