### FETE DAY PROMISES SUCCESS

ONE HUNDRED CONTESTANTS WILL BE ENTERED.

MEDALS ARE TO BE AWARDED

This Year's High School Meet to be the Best One Held Since Inauguration of Custom.

Seventeen high schools will be entered in the Fete Day contest which will occur on Nebraska Field Saturday, May 18. The time set for the first event is 2:30 p. m.

There will be about one hundred contestants altogether, which will mean a total of 250 entries. Owing to the fact that no high school will send any contestants other than the pick of all the athletes, there is no doubt that this meet will be of the highest athletic quality, and the men who win will be the best men.

#### No Delay.

Arrangements have been made for twenty-four races, and they will be pulled off on schedule time, accordingly there will not be the usual delay between events that has been a marked feature at former state high school meets.

In order that the crowd may have the full benefit of all that is to be seen, it has been arranged that no persons shall be on the field except the contestants. These will be made to stand on the opposite side of the event going on, so that the view will not be changed our minds about taking the blocked for the spectators.

At all times during the afternoon there will be three events taking place, one race and two in the field. In this way the whole meet will be over in two hours and a half.

#### Events in the Morning.

The shot put and hammer throw will take place at eleven o'clock Saturday morning so that there will be no danger of anyone being injured as a result of wild throws. At a large number of high school field days some accident has occurred when these events come off along with the rest of the meet, accordingly it was deemed best by the officials to set the time for these in the morning.

#### The Medals.

For all first places a gold medal will be awarded, for seconds a silver medal and for third place one of bronze. Fourth places will be awarded a banner of expensive material. as also will the school winning the It's ho! for the regiment, marching meet, and the winners of the relays.

### Seats Reserved.

Near the finish line 350 seats have been reserved which will be ten cents extra, the general admission being twenty-five cents. Tickets may be obtained at any of the book stores

It has also been arranged so that no one will have to cross the field in order to reach the grandstand.

Much time has been put upon the arrangement of this year's Fete Day and it is the opinion of the officials that it will be better than any formerly held.
