NEW BUILDING CREATES INTEREST IN LAW COLLEGE

That the College of Law of the University is an important department in the work at Nebraska is evidenced by the recent authorization of a new building on the city campus for the exclusive use of that college. There has been appropriated for this purpose \$85,000, exclusive of the cost of equipment, and this amount will provide a building sixty-three by one hundred thirty six feet, and three stories in height exclusive of the base

This acquisition of a building by the college has caused an increase of in terest in the work and equipment of that part of the University. The requirements for admission have been raised so that it is now necessary for the embryo lawyer to have finished one year of work in the Arts and Sciences College before entering upon the real work in the law. The legal work itself covers a course extending over a period of three years. and includes not only the essentials. such as property, contracts, torts, etc. but also the more specialized studies of admiralty, administrative law, irrigation law and many others which are included in elective courses. The stu dent is required to take eight hours of this elective work besides the average of fourteen hours of required work for six semesters.
