beat to capture the half mile event, Bermond pushed the peerless Davenport last spring in the conference meet to such an extent that he had to make a mark of 1:58 in order to beat the "horn dawg" man. To beat the long Cornhusker, Bermond will have to come considerably under two minutes.

May, the star of last year's team,

has come back. He ran a hundred in even time Tuesday night and is expected to make Wilson, the little Coe flyer, go his best. Christmas is rounding into fair condition and is expected to place in the two-twenty.

Banney, the surprise of the season in the low hurdles, had another severe fall Monday, but in no way has it interfered with this week's practice. He has some very fast men to meet at the meet Saturday, but will make a very favorable showing for a first season man in an event that usually takes years of practice.

Nebraska's chances in the quarter are confined to second place. Beaver, who has run consistently all season with Brannon, will push any of them. Brannon has been in very poor shape all season, owing largely to the cold weather. He is a hot weather man and should be better Saturday than at any time this spring. These men also have to meet Bermond.

Bates has to meet Murray, the Jay hawk, and Drury of Des Moines College in the two mile. Both of these men are good for less than ten minutes in the long race and Bates will have to make better time than ever before to win. He may place, however.

In the relays Nebraska should be among the strongest. The half mile will probably be May, Christmas, Racedy and Wherry. All of this quartette are good for 23 seconds in the two-twenty, which is the distance each man must run. The mile team will be Anderson, Beaver, Brannon and Barney, with McGowan as an alternate. None of them are slower than 52, which means a real fast team.
