

ATHLETIC TICKETS ON SALE.

Black Masks and Innocents Aid in Student Ticket Campaign—Saving of Six Dollars Possible.

Student athletic tickets were put on sale Monday at both the book stores and the Y M C A. A brisk sale is reported so far, but there are many students yet who have not availed themselves of this opportunity. In order to make this year a record breaker in the number of tickets sold the Black Mask and Innocent societies are aiding in the campaign.

An estimate of the number of athletic contests during the year would be twenty-four, the general admission to which would otherwise cost at least \$9. This is offered to students and faculty for the sum of \$3 so that every one in the University shall find himself financially able to not only be present at all contests but be a genuine booster as well. For the benefit of the coeds it is announced that the management is planning to have a girls' section this year, following the custom of previous years.

The holders of the season tickets are given as good seats as the reserved section, the only difference being that they are on the south side of the field. If you wish to have your seats reserved the tickets are honored for the price of general admission for the particular game.

A revised Calendar will appear in the Nebraskan as other less important events are arranged for.

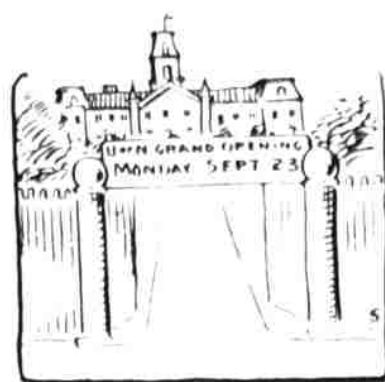
HAINER AWARD GOES OVER.

Cup Offered Last Year for Fraternity Scholarship Stays in Possession of Delta Tau.

Speculation between several rival fraternities as to which one would receive the Hainer cup has taken a drop with the announcement that there would be no award this year.

The cup was offered last fall by Mr. E. J. Hainer of Lincoln to the Greek letter fraternity maintaining the best record during the year just past. At the time there was no public announcement of the gift. It was given to the Delta Tau Delta fraternity for them to hold as long as the condition of scholarship was lived up to. It seemed to be the understanding among fraternity men at that time that the competition was then in force, and it was with some surprise that the announcement was made that the awarding of the prize would be deferred until next September.

The donor of the cup was desirous that some publicity be attached to the gift before the contest is entered into, and has therefore expressed the wish that nothing be done about it at this time. It is probable that some time in the near future the fraternity men will be called together and a formal presentation and acceptance of the trophy made.
