First-Voters will please remember Friday that a new registration of all persons entitled to vote is required by law of whomas the same. The Sooners each year.

Second Persons that registered at the time of voting on April 19, and are now living in the same precinct they did at that time, do not need to reregister.

Third - Voters that registered on April 19, primary election day, and have moved from their former residence, should appear before the registration board in their old precinct and secure a certificate of removal, and take such certificate of removal to the board in the precinct where they now reside and have their registration entered up anew

Fourth First voters that have not registered before or that will become of age on or before November 5 are entitled to register Saturday, October 26, if they have the general qualifications, which are set out in the statute as follows: "Every male person who shall have resided in the state six months, in the county forty day, and in the precinct ten days" and "persons of foreign birth who shall have declared their intention to become citi zens conformably to the laws of the United States on the subject of naturalization, at least thirty days point to an election, shall be electors "
