

## VARSITY GETS JOLT

FRESHMEN GIVE OPPONENTS A STIFF TROUNCING YESTERDAY.

## USE MANY PASSES FOR GAINS

Make But Three Touchdowns to Varsity's Five, But Play Better Ball  
—Hospital List Growing Smaller.

Forward passes very beautifully executed almost proved the Cornhuskers' undoing in yesterday's game between the varsity and the freshmen. The first-year men, with the assistance of "Turp" Frank, were able to make three touchdowns, while the varsity was held to five.

The game started off with a rush, and in a few minutes Captain Frank made the first touchdown. The varsity then started a march toward the freshmen's goal, but Towle changed his mind and made a beautiful drop kick from the 30-yard line. During the game Halligan carried the ball over for two touchdowns, Beck, Pearson and Frank each making one.

### Freshmen Utilize Pass.

In the third quarter the first-year men began to try a series of forward passes which netted them a touchdown. "Turp" Frank did the passing for the first-year men, and some passing it was, too. Throwing the ball from 10 to 40 yards with the freshmen backs receiving the pass almost every time, they soon had the varsity going. The regulars were unable to stop the plays, and time after time the nifty freshmen backs snatched the passes from the hands of the varsity men.

### Varsity Plays Straight Ball.

The Cornhuskers did not try much open play, depending mostly upon straight football. The tackles carried the ball for good gains, but the backfield men were the ones who made the long runs. The line played a good game

against the freshmen and found little difficulty in opening holes for the backs. Referee Purdy penalized the varsity heavily for holding. Offside plays were not much in evidence, but the holding more than made up for it.

### Hospital List.

Harmon was unable to get into the scrimmage on account of his ankle. Potter, who injured his ankle in the Missouri game, was also out of the lineup. Purdy's knee is improving rapidly, but he will not be able to go against Doane Saturday. Meyers' injured shoulder is healing nicely and he was able to get into the game for a few minutes yesterday. All of the rest of the squad are in the pink of condition except for a few minor bruises and scratches. Jimmy.
